All decided not to pursue

Linda Donaldson: We have 120 active members as of day of board meeting. However, of that total 40 members have not renewed membership for 2022-2023. State LWV put forth a challenge to increase membership by 2% by end of year. So that means that we need an active renewed head count of 111 members for 2023. Several renewal notices have been sent out to membership as reminder. Also, special thanks to Jean Baker for helping Linda Donaldson write Thank You letters.

Voter Services: 1st event had to be postponed due to rain, but there is a long list of summer events that LWV voter registers will be present.

Those that are certified to assist in Voter Registration please check that you are current on testing. Every 2 years you must renew. If you are trying to renew please be aware that the LWV test site is under construction, call or email Blake Summerlin who is with LWV State.

Paula Mimms: gave overview of what the Health Care Committee has been up to which included making contact with minority liaison, Shantel Jones. Paula Mimms became member of task force under Shantel Jones. Their first meeting will be June 1st.

Blood Pressure Cuffs are the focus: Health Care Committee made contact with Polk County Health Department and they have agreed to hand out Blood Pressure Cuffs to expecting mothers who come in for first prenatal care visit. Health Care Committee is going to be purchasing cuffs using donation funds and applying for Simply Health Care Grant equaling \$10k. There are still some logistical obstacles to work out, but the general idea is to make this a sustainable effort for at least 3 years acquiring future funds through sponsorships.

Andy Crossfield – has volunteered to head the Gun Safety Committee.

Updated Notes from May 1, 2022 Voter Services meeting

DEI Theme along with Voter Registration – DEI to be blended into our Voter Registration tables. More event details covered further in the report.

Certification – Larry and Linda have been in touch with Blake Summerlin at LWVFL. Certification must be updated every two years. The certification test site is labeled as "Under Construction". It can be accessed but special instructions are necessary. Linda can help anyone needing to renew their certification. Blake would like any new volunteers to contact him.

SB-90 - SB 90's status was changing in April and May. What had previously affected VR most directly was the requirement to verbally caution registrants that Third Party Voter Registration Organizations (3PVROs) may not get voter registrations to the SOE within the 14-day deadline. This part of SB-90 was reversed by the Florida legislators in 2021.

Payment of Booth Fees – This year we are paying the requested booth fees for the events we have planned so far. DEI (Bobbie Harris and Katy Byrd) has used some budget money for the May 21st event, Ann Weeks has covered the Lakeland Juneteenth event and Nancy M Simmons paid for our space at the Winter Haven Juneteenth. Please thank all these dedicated LWV Polk members for their generosity.
