Remembering The Stolen Girls

NPR brings their story back into the spotlight with July feature



LWV Polk's Black History Month event in 2019 featured Pastor Eddie Lake speaking on "The History and The Present" and Haines City Commissioner, Anne Huffman, speaking about "The Stolen Girls of Leesburg Stockade."

The large group of attendees was immersed in the emotion of both presentations, and particularly the introduction of Ms. Melissa Williams, who accompanied Ms. Huffman. Ms. Williams, a Polk resident, is one of the Stolen Girls of Americus, Georgia. Despite not addressing the group, her presence caused a deep stirring among those present. Mr. Bill Futch, so poignantly moved, spoke from the back of the room.

"Ms. Williams, I am Bill Futch. I lived in Americus during that time," he began. Bill apologized for his community and also for his own lack of awareness of the situation of these girls and for Blacks in general at that time. He is close to the age of Ms. Williams.

The connection between these two people prompted efforts by our League to sponsor a video conversation between them. We then negotiated with the Media Lab at Florida Polytechnic University to continue this with the help of students. Unfortunately, COVID prevented the effort from coming to fruition.

LWV Polk delivered the message of this story as far as we could, but want to make sure that our whole membership is aware of this remarkable story. Take a moment to listen to NPR's 12-minute segment on the Stolen Girls.

Gun Safety Committee Partners with Early Learning Coalition of Polk County

Free gun locks are now available at many daycare centers across the county

The Gun Safety Committee, led by chair Trudy Rankin, has begun a collaboration with ELC of Polk County to get free gun locks distributed to daycare centers across Polk County.

In addition, the committee has partnered with Moms Demand Action to provide gun locks and educational materials, which they are now working to get translated into Spanish.

In total, they have given out at least 1,000 gun locks in various venues.
